Powering the projector On / Off

Powering On the Projector

- Connect the power cord to the projector and to the power source. When connected, the POWER/STANDBY LED lights Amber.
- 2. Press **U** on the control panel or on the remote control. The POWER/STANDBY LED lights Blue.

The startup screen displays in approximately 3 seconds. The first time you use the projector, you may be asked to select the preferred language and power saving mode.


- 3. Turn on and connect the source signal that you want to display on the screen (computer, notebook, video player, etc). The projector detects the source automatically.
- 4. If you connect multiple sources at the same time, press ◆ → on the control panel or the direct source key on the remote control to switch between inputs.



When Power mode (Standby) is set to Eco (> 0.5W) and the projector is in standby mode, VGA output, Audio pass-through and RJ45 are deactivated.



If the projector does not automatically search for source, press on the control panel or the Menu button on the remote control. Go to "OPTIONS" and set "Source Lock" to "Off". See page 42.



Powering Off the Projector



- 2. Press **U** again to confirm. The projector goes to standby mode and the POWER/STANDBY LED lights Amber.
 - If you wish to turn the projector on, press $\boldsymbol{\upsilon}$ to restart the projector.
- To completely turn the projector off, disconnect the power cord from the electrical outlet.

Warning Indicator

Warning indicators light up and the projector automatically shuts down in the following conditions:

- "Light" LED indicator is lit amber and the "POWER/ STANDBY" indicator flashes red.
- "TEMP" LED indicator is lit yellow green and the "POWER/ STANDBY" indicator flashes red. This indicates the projector has overheated. Under normal conditions, the projector can be switched back on.
- "TEMP" LED indicator flashes yellow green and the "POWER/STANDBY" indicator flashes red.

Unplug the power cord from the projector, wait for 30 seconds and try again. If the warning indicator lights up again, contact your nearest service center for assistance.



The "Power Off" message disappears if no button is pressed after 15 seconds.



Adjusting the Projected Image Adjusting the Projector's Height

The projector is equipped with elevator feet for adjusting the image height.


- 1. Locate the adjustable foot you wish to modify on the underside of the projector.
- 2. Rotate the adjustable ring clockwise to raise the projector or counter clockwise to lower it. Repeat with the remaining feet as needed.



Adjusting the Projector's Focus


To focus the image, rotate the focus ring until the image is clear.

- XGA series: The projector will focus at distances from 1.64 to 8.2 feet (0.5 to 2.5 meters).
- WXGA series: The projector will focus at distances from 1.64 to 8.2 feet (0.5 to 2.5 meters).

Where Projectors Roam Free

Projecting Image

When the projector is turned on, it automatically searches for connected devices.

Once a device is detected, the projector projects the image or the menu of the input source, such as in:

- Network Display: When a local area network or wireless network is detected (see "Connect to Network" on page 16).
- ▶ USB Display: When a computer is connected through the mini USB port of the projector (see "USB Display mode" on page 62).
- Memory Drive Display: When a flash drive or SD card is detected (see "Memory Drive Display" on page 47).

Switch Input Source

If the desired input source is not included in the auto search function (see Input Source menu) or more than one input source devices are connected, you can switch the input source manually by doing one of the following:

- Press the direct input source key on the remote control.
- ► Press on the control panel repeatedly to scroll through the options.
- Press the **Source** key on the remote control repeatedly to scroll through the options.

Refresh Input Source

While the projector is operating and a new input source device is connected, press ☑ ▶ on the control panel or the **Re-Sync** key on the remote control to refresh and synchronize the projector with the input sources.




- Only input sources selected in the Input Source menu (see *) will be auto searched by the projector.
- The number of input sources to auto search may affect the length of time for the projector to finish the search.

On-screen Display Menu

The Projector has a multilingual On-screen Display menu that allows you to make image adjustments and change your projector settings.

How to operate

- 2. When the OSD menu is displayed, use ◀▶ keys to select an item on the main menu.
- 4. Use the ▲ ▼ keys to select the desired item and adjust the settings using the ◀ ▶ keys.
- Press or Enter to confirm. The screen returns to the main menu.
- 6. To exit, press or **Menu** again. The OSD menu closes and the projector automatically saves the new settings.




- ▶ **Show Login Code**: Click to display the login code of the projector on the upper left corner of the screen for 10 seconds.
- Web Admin: Opens Optoma web utility (see "Open Optoma Web Utility" on page 67.
- Search Server: Click to search and connect to the projector.
- Projection Quality: Select the projection quality: "Normal" for faster projection or "Best" for better quality but slower speed.
- ▶ **Projection Source**: Select "Main Screen" to project the computer desktop or the "Virtual Extended Screen".
- ▶ **Send Audio to Display**: Select "Yes" to route the audio output to the projetor. The audio driver must be installed to use this feature.
- Connection Profile: Select "Save current as" to save the current connection settings as a profile for later use or select "Manage profile" to use or edit an existing profile.
- ▶ **Auto WiFi Connect**: Check to enable auto WiFi discovery and connection to the projector.



To use the "Virtual Extended Screen", download the driver first from open the Optoma Web Utility page. Click your computer operating system to start the download

- ▶ Auto Power Manager: Check to allow the projector to change your computer power scheme to the "highest performance" for better projection quality.
- ► **Hide UI**: Check to hide the OPS control panel on the projected screen.
- ▶ Advanced Screen Capture: Check to display the operating system tip or pop-up windows on the projected screen.
- ▶ Make OPS Token: Click to make an OPS application token. A setup wizard appears, follow the instructions on the screen to make the OPS token.



- ► Copy Application to Desktop: Click to create an OPS shortcut icon on your desktop.
- About: Click to display the software and network information.
- **Exit**: Click to stop the connection and close the application.

Using Remote Desktop

When the projector and the computer are connected through OPS, plug a standard USB keyboard or USB mouse into the USB port of the projector and remotely control the computer.

Web Utility: Conference Control

The Conference Control function allows you to control how you want to project images from up to four computers using the Optoma Web Utility.

- 1. Activate Network Display and open the Optoma Web Utility page (see "Network Display mode" on page 66).
- 2. On the left panel menu, click **Conference Control**. The Conference screen appears.




- 3. Enter the password (default="admin").
- 4. Click **Login**.



- Supports up to 32 users connected to the system at the same time.
- To manage the conference, users need to login to the conference control page.
- If there is a proxy server being configured in the Internet setting of the client PC, users may not be able to access the web server.

Web Utility: Admin Settings

Use the Admin function of the Optoma Web Utility to remotely view and modify the projector settings. An administrator password is required to login.

- 1. Activate Network Display and open the Optoma Web Utility page (see "Network Display mode" on page 66).
- 2. On the left panel menu, click Admin.



- 3. Enter the administrator login password (default="admin").
- 4. Click Login. The System Status screen appears.



5. Click a menu on the left panel to display the screen.

The **Network Setup** screen displays and allows you to change the network settings of the projector, such as the **IP Setup**, **DHCP Server Setup**, **Wireless Setup**, and **GateKeeper**.

When changes are made, click **Apply** to save and apply the settings.

ADMIN | Video Output Setup



Use the **Video Ouput Setup** screen to select the **Login Code** option and configure the **Projector Name**.

When changes are made, click **Apply** to save and apply the settings.

ADMIN | Change Passwords



Use the **Change Passwords** screen to change the login password for **Conference Control** and **Admin** access. Only one type of password can be changed at a time.

- 1. Type the password in Enter New Password.
- 2. Re-type the same password in **Confirm New Password**.
- 3. Click **Apply** to save the apply the changes.
- 4. A "Password has been changed" message appears, click **OK** to close the message.

To change the other type of password, access the **Change Passwords** screen again and perform the above steps.

ADMIN | Projector Control Panel



Use the **Projector Control Panel** screen to remotely modify the projector settings, such as **Brightness**, **Keystone**, **Display Mode**, **Background Color**, and others.

ADMIN | Alert Setting



Use the **Alert Setting** screen to configure the projector to send out email alerts when errors occur, such as fan failure, high temperature, or light source failure.

- 1. Select **Enable** to enable the email alert feature.
- 2. In the **Email Alert** section, enter the following information:
 - ▶ **To**: Email address where you want to send the email alert.
 - Cc: Second email address where you want to send the email alert.
 - ▶ From: Email address from where the email alert is sent.
 - ▶ **Subject**: Subject title of the email alerts.
- In the SMTP Setting section, enter the following information:
 - Outgoing SMTP Server: The SMTP server of the email address from where email alerts are sent.
 - Username: User name of the SMTP server.
 - Password: Password of the SMTP server.
- In the Alert Condition section, check the type of email notification that you want to receive. You may select more than one condition.
- 5. When done, click **Save** to save and apply the settings.



- Obtain the SMTP information from your network administrator.
- Click the Email Alert Test button to test the email alert settings.

ADMIN | Reset to Default



Use the **Reset to Default** screen to restore the network settings to its default factory settings. Click Apply to proceed with the reset.

ADMIN | Crestron RoomView

Click Crestron RoomView to access Crestron from the Admin settings screen (see "Crestron RoomView" on page 84 for more information).

ADMIN | Reboot System


Click **Reboot System** to logout and reboot the Optoma Web Utility page.

Crestron RoomView

Crestron RoomView works as a remote control station of your projector when connected over a network. Crestron allows you to change and re-sync input sources, show the on-screen display menu, and adjust the projector settings right on your computer.

Using Crestron RoomView

- 1. Activate Network Display and open the Optoma Web Utility page (see "Network Display mode" on page 66).
- 2. On the left panel menu, click **Crestron**. The Crestron RoomView screen appears.

WiFi-Doc allows your Android/iOS device to show the native office file to big screens (projectors, TVs, etc.) through Wi-Fi connection. It leverage Picsel's office engine to read the native office files (including word, excel, powerpoint, pdf, txt) then display on local display and big screen.



PtG2 Converter

PtG2 Converter is a computer software that allows you to convert PowerPoint (*.ppt) files to PtG2 format playable on PtG supported phones without loss of original slide transitionand animation effects.

Using PtG2 Converter

- On the supplied User Manual CD, browse and install the PtG Converter file.
- After installation, go to Start > Programs > PtG2
 Converter > PtG2 Converter. The PtG panel appears.



- Click to select a PowerPoint file and start conversion. Conversion progress is displayed on the desktop.
- Click to expand or collapse the preview pane.
- ► Click to playback the PtG2 file.
- Click to open a PtG2 file.

Limitations:

PtG supports all animation effects that can be displayed on the desktop screen. However, PtG CANNOT/DOES NOT support the following conditions:

- 1. PtG does not support animation effect that is using timer or repeat function to playback automatically.
- 2. PtG does not support single animation effect that is longer than 60 seconds. If there is a recycling animation effect, PtG will record it for up to 60 second.
- 3. If the PPT screen stops to change for 3 seconds, the system will distinguish it as the end of the current animation and will prompt for the "Enter" key to ask PPT for next step.
- 4. PtG does not support embedded VBA object.
- 5. PtG does not support OLE object.

Troubleshooting

If you experience a problem with your projector, refer to the following information. If a problem persists, contact your local reseller or service center.

? No image appears on-screen

- ▶ Ensure all the cables and power connections are correctly and securely connected as described in the "Installation" section.
- ▶ Ensure all the pins of the connectors are not bent or broken.
- Make sure the projector is turned on.
- ▶ Ensure that the "AV mute" feature is not turned on.

? Partial, scrolling or incorrectly displayed image

- ▶ Press on the control panel or Re-Sync on the remote control.
- ▶ If you are using a PC:

For Windows 95, 98, 2000, XP, Windows 7:

- 1. Open "My Computer", the "Control Panel" folder, and then double click on the "Display" icon.
- 2. Select the "Settings" tab.
- 3. Verify that your display resolution setting is lower than or equal to UXGA (1600×1200).
- 4. Click on the "Advanced Properties" button.

If the projector is still not projecting the whole image, you need to change the monitor display you are using. Refer to the following steps.

- Verify the resolution setting is lower than or equal to UXGA (1600 × 1200).
- 2. Select the "Change" button under the "Monitor" tab.
- Click on "Show all devices". Next, select "Standard monitor types" under the SP box; choose the resolution mode you need under the "Models" box.

- Verify that the resolution setting of the monitor display is lower than or equal to UXGA (1600 × 1200).
- If you are using a Notebook:
 - First, follow the steps above to adjust resolution of the computer.
 - 2. Press the appropriate keys listed below for your notebook manufacturer to send signal out from your notebook to the projector. Example: [Fn]+[F4]

? Image is out of focus

- ▶ Make sure the lens cap is removed.
- Adjust the Focus Ring on the projector lens.
- Make sure the projection screen is between the required distance. See page 16.

The image is stretched when displaying 16:9 DVD title

- When you play anamorphic DVD or 16:9 DVD, the projector will show the best image when the projector display mode is set to 16:9 in the OSD.
- ▶ If you play 4:3 format DVD titles, please change the format to 4:3 in the projector OSD.
- ▶ If the image is still stretched, adjust the aspect ratio.
- Set the display format of your DVD player to 16:9 (wide) aspect ratio.

? Image is too small or too large

- ▶ Move the projector closer to or further from the screen.
- Press on the control panel or Menu on the remote control. Go to "DISPLAY → Format" and try the different settings.

Image has slanted sides

- If possible, reposition the projector so that it is horizontally centered on the screen and below the bottom of the screen.
- ▶ Press "Keystone +/-" button on the remote control or press "☐ / ☐" on the control panel, until the sides are vertical.

? Image is reversed


- Press
 ☐ on the control panel or Menu on the remote control. Go to "SETUP → Projection" from the OSD and adjust the projection direction.
- The projector stops responding to all controls
 - Check that "Keypad Lock" is not activated by trying to control the projector with the remote control.

▶ If possible, turn off the projector, then unplug the power cord and wait at least 60 seconds before reconnecting power.

If the remote control does not work

- ► Ensure that the operating angle of the remote control is within ±15° horizontally and vertically to one of the IR receivers on the projector.
- ▶ Remove any obstructions between the remote control and the projector. Move to within 7 m (±0°) of the projector.
- ▶ Make sure the batteries are inserted correctly.
- ▶ Replace batteries if they are exhausted.






